Comelec to procure 1000 reams of ballot papers

52.7 million voters registered for the Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) polls. Even after Noah Paper Mills--the winning bidder for paper ballots--completely delivered on October 6 4,952 reams of ballot papers amounting to Php 71.8 million to be used in printing the barangay official ballots, the Commission on Elections Bids and Awards Committee (Comelec BAC) said that the National Printing Office (NPO) will need an additional 300 reams of ballot papers following a five percent rate of ballot paper spoilage. The Commission decided to procure 1000 reams of ballot papers to save Php2 million in expenses. The Commission explained that purchasing 300 reams of ballot paper would cost Php 16.5 million while 1000 reams would only amount to Php 14.5 million. The Commission said that the remaining 700 reams that will not be used will be allotted for subsequent electoral exercises, such as plebiscites, special elections and recall elections. The Comelec has authorized the BAC to resort to a repeat order from the paper supplier as it was impractical to conduct another competitive bidding with the Barangay elections set on October 25.

The Comelec should assure the public that the remaining 350,000 pieces of ballot (1 tream = 500 papers) paper will be accounted for, properly stored and that the amount of expenses for the next election will be lessened. Perhaps in the future, the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) could consider procuring the same kind of paper that the Comelec uses for its manual ballots; any excess paper could be distributed by the DBM to other government agencies as common office supplies. Comelec needs additional Php800 million for ARMM elections

ARMM polls have been scheduled on August 10, 2011. The said regional elections will be automated as the 2008 ARMM election was, albeit using a different system. The lease for 800 machines for the automated polls will be around Php 1.839 billion as estimated by Smartmatic International. Comelec has submitted a budget proposal of Php 1.149 billion for the ARMM polls but it was cut by more than half to Php 480.9 million in the 2011 budget. The Comelec will submit to Congress a request for Php 800 million supplemental budget after the Barangay and SK elections. Additional outlay will mainly cover the lease of precinct count optical scan (PCOS) machines and remuneration for the boards of election inspector.

The Comelec should review the proposed improvements by election monitors and IT experts regarding the Smartmatic poll technology so the same glitches and mistakes would not be encountered again. (KZR)
